



Year 1 Willow and Oak class weekly overview

| PSHE | Working as a team | Talk about the things that you do together at home. Set a challenge that is better/easier with 2 or more people helping. E.g. Tidying up, playing a game, baking a cake etc |
| Literacy | We are retelling the story of the 3 Little Pigs, orally and in writing. | <p>This week we are going to be writing the story of the 3 little Pigs. We will do this in 3 sessions. Beginning, middle and end. Ask your child to retell the story thinking carefully about the order of the main events. Look at the pictures. What's happening in each picture? Can you put them in the right order from 1-6?</p> <p>Which words do we use to start a fairy tale? Once upon time.....</p> <p>Support your child to write each section of the story. Encourage them to write keywords or a simple sentence if appropriate.</p> |
