Can you follow the instructions to plant the seed?</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1- Put some soil in a pot.</li><li>2- Make a hole in the soil.</li><li>3- Put the seed in the hole.</li><li>4- Cover the seed.</li><li>5- Water the seed.</li><li>6- Put in sunny place in garden.</li></ol> <p>Can you watch the seed and see if it grows. Don't forget to water your plant.</p>

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<p>Communication and Language</p>	<p><u>Following instructions</u> <b>I can follow 1 step and 2 step instructions.</b> Can you make your own playdough? <u>What you will need:</u> 1 cup white flour. 1 cup water. few drops of food coloring. 1/2 cup salt. 1 teaspoon vegetable oil. 1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar. <u>Instructions:</u> Combine all ingredients in a saucepan and cook over medium heat, constantly stirring so it doesn't stick to the pan. When the mixture starts to stick together and form a ball, remove the pan from the stove. Let the dough get cool enough to touch before playing.</p>
