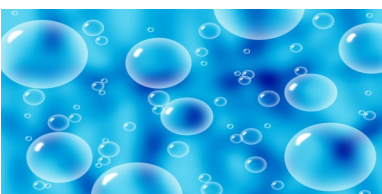
Due to the lovely weather the children enjoyed visiting, playing and having a picnic in the school grounds.
