	Learning Objective	Suggested Activities
PSHE	We are thinking about our friends at school.	Can your children think of the names of the children in their Class? How can we work as a team to look after and respect each other? Choose a friend and draw a picture of them. Write some words around it to describe your friend.
Literacy	Introduction to 3 Little pigs story	If you have a copy of the 3 Little Pigs story (any version) please read it to your child. If you don't, the link below takes you to a traditional version. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=QLR2pLUsl-Y Draw a picture of the 3 Pigs. Write around what the children know about the story. Have a go at 'hot seating'. For example, one of you is the a pig and the other asks questions such as "How did you feel when you heard the wolf?" " What did you make your house out of?" etc.....
Phonics	Phase 3 phonics To be able to read and write words with ow and oi sounds. How many words can you think of with those sounds in? Write a list of the words you that thought of. Can you write a sentence using some of those words?
Maths	We are learning that a number can be partitioned (split) into 2 or more parts.	Count out a group of up to 10 (or 20 if your chuld's confident) small objects. Split into 2 groups. Ask your child to count the amount in each group. Write it down as an addition sentence. Put both groups together and recount to find the total. Try again with a different amount There is an excellent BBC bitesize lesson explaining addition, partitioning and part/part/whole. 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<p>History</p>	<p>We are thinking about respect and remembrance of all people and animals who died in wars to protect us.</p>	<p>Remembrance Day. What do the children know about Remembrance Day? Watch the CBBC Poppies animation https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=pv_ub7Be7oA Talk about what Poppies represent. Talk about bravery and sacrifice and people who have died so that we can have a fairer and safer world to live in. <p>Music</p>	<p>We are listening to different pieces of music and describing how it makes us feel.</p>	<p>Choose a favourite piece of music and talk to your children about it. Is it fast? Slow? Can they clap along to the beat? How does the music make them feel? Happy? Sad? Fell like dancing!? Does it remind them of/make them think about something? Choose a contrasting piece of music and ask the same questions.</p>	
<p>Forest School</p>	<p>We are making cosy dens for woodland animals.</p>	<p>Choose a woodland animal e.g. badger, fox, squirrel, hedgehog..... Think about that animal and what sort of house they'd like to live in. Would it be big/small? On the ground? In a tree? Draw a design of the den and what you might use to make it. Can you make a cosy den in your house?</p>
