

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Activities to complete throughout the week	
Science	<p>Materials, Everyday items</p> <p>Can you find items made out of metal in your house? What are they? What do they feel like? Why do you think they are made out of metal? Can you describe the object?</p>
Art	<p>Can you create a spaceship using shape this week?</p> <p>Here's one of the illustrations from 'Lights on Cotton Rock' can you recreate it or come up with your own new spaceship?</p> <p>You could use coloured circles, tin foil, chalks/pastels, paint or colouring pencils.</p> 
History	<p>Please watch this video clip; KS2: Neil Armstrong - BBC Teach</p> <p>We have been focusing on the theme of space. Why do you think this?</p> <p>Would did you find out from the video clip?</p> <p>Can you write down any facts?</p>
Music and PE/Dance	<p>Can you practise some different gymnastic shapes to music? Choose a song that you really like and practise these shapes;</p> <p>Pencil shape, tuck shape, straddle shape, star, happy/sad cat, front/back support and dish shape.</p> <p>You could also practise and explore some travelling movements such as;</p> <p>Sliding, jumping walking on tip toes, crawling, shuffling, turning, galloping, hopping, skipping and side stepping.</p> <p>Rolls - forward rolls, log/pencil rolls and teddy bear rolls</p> <p>See if you can come up with a little routine.</p>
