
















































































































































Can your child put them back into the right order? If so, try it with numbers 0-20. Say a number. Can your child find that number? <b>Science</b>	Seasons – Winter Ice investigations	<p>We are going to do some ice experiments that could easily be done at home. Beforehand you will need to make some ice. You could use any small containers or ice cube trays.</p> <p>Talk about Winter. What is the weather usually like? How does outside look different to how it does in the Summer? What happens to water in puddles when it's cold?</p>	 <p>Let's do an experiment to see if we can make ice melt.</p>
