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Acorns - Morning Session



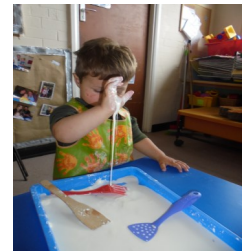
We all had a wonderful time at Forest School. The children looked for insects under the logs, negotiated moving along slippery surfaces and ran freely between the trees.
