Can you sound out and record the word using the new digraph gramphemes?</p>
<p>Maths</p> 	<p>Money I can explore money and sort it into denominations. I can state how much a coin is worth. Can you watch the money song? https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=dFzAU3uO6Ps</p>  <p>Can you get some coins out. Can you sort the coins into their different types. Can you say how much they are worth? Can you use some counters (e.g. lego or buttons etc.). Can you count out the amount that each coin is worth?</p>
<p>UTW</p> 	<p>Planting Sunflowers Can you look at the sunflower that you have planted? What does it look like this week? Can you draw a picture of what it looks like and tell an adult about any changes that you notice.</p>
<p>Physical Development</p> 	<p>Cosmic Kids Yoga To be able to move in different ways. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ASPnHI7kio4 Can follow Jamie's Yoga moves on Cosmic kids? See if you can do all the moves and hold the balances.</p> <p>Fine motor activity: Can you collect some leaves from the garden. Hole punch some holes into the leaves. Can you now thred ribbon through the holes in the leaves?</p>
<p>Expressive Arts Development</p>	<p>Painting Sunflowers I can use colour and materials for a purpose. Can you look at the picture of Van Gogh's sunflowers? Do you remember we learnt about him during Home Learning? Can you paint your own sunflowers? Look at pictures of sunflowers and see if you can paint your own masterpiece!</p>

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<p>Forest School</p> 	<p>Treasure hunt I can explore color in my natural environment. I can explore changes in my natural Can you go into your garden? Can you find something for each colour on the chart?
