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Apple and Cherry Class

Another super week in Cherry and Apple Class.

We have been learning to retell the story a Squash and a Squeeze. We have thought of our own actions to the story and sequenced pictures to put the story in order. Also, we have listened to the song walking through the jungle. However, we have changed the words to 'walking through the farm yard'. We then spotted the animals in the story: a hen, a goat, a pig and a cow. In Maths we have been making repeating patterns using natural objects. We were great at carrying on a repeated pattern, at making our own and for spotting the adults mistakes in their patterns! We also used different things in our play, like duplo, to make repeating patterns. To add to this, we've been testing our memory with a memory game. An adult has been showing us a group of items and then hiding them under a cloth. The adult then takes one of these items away and we've had to guess what it missing. Sometimes it really tricked us, but other times we got it straight away! Maybe you would like to play this game at home too. Next week we are going to make our own story maps for a squash and a squeeze and we have the life bus coming on Thursday to talk all about our bodies.

Birch, Maple & Walnut Class

This week we have really enjoyed writing the middle part of the story Mr Big! We have thought about using capital letters, full stops, !, ? and using sound mats to help us. In Year 1 we have been looking at one more in Maths and have used maths equipment and pictorial representations to see it in different ways. In Year 2, we have been practising to count in 2's, 5's, 10's and 3's and have used equipment to show our understanding of a sequence. We have been doing observational drawings of the inside of pumpkins in art. We have really enjoyed our class assemblies and it has been amazing to see so many of you attend. Thank you!

We think all of the children have been incredible!

Next week we will be writing the end of our story. We will continue with our work in maths looking at counting and one less. We are also having a visit from Coram Life Education where we will be learning all about our feelings. We will be having a Halloween theme in our classrooms and rainbow room next week where we will be creating potions, writing spells and reading books such as Room on the Broom, Pick a Pumpkin and Pumpkin Soup! We will be working scientifically to make fizzing potions, dissolve spider ice hands and make slime. We will finish the week with the Halloween Non-School Uniform day on Thursday 21st October!!
